Entries

This is not an official Equine Canada event, but we will be using the Equine Canada Eventing entry form. You can find the form by going to www.equinecanada.com/eventing, select from the left hand menu, "Competitor Information", then click the link that comes up (Competitor Information and Entry Forms) and then click "Entry Form 2010"

Cheques must be dated for the due date (Thursday, May 20th). Please make cheques payable to **Horse Trials PEI**

Entries are \$40.00 per division for members of Horse Trials and Pony Club, \$50.00 per division for non-members. On Saturday, May 22nd we are having a course clean up and cross country jumping building day at Strathgartney from around 8am to 5pm. **Competitors who come to help out on the 22nd will get a \$10 refund off their entry fee.** You do not have to have any special skills to help out, we just need lots of helping hands.

Competitors must have PSO insurance (Island Horse Council or NSEF. NB riders must have proof of EC insurance.) Off Island riders please send photocopies of your insurance with your entry.

Tests

Ride Times

Ride times will be available Saturday, May 22nd, at the Cross-country building day at Strathgartney, or from the Deborah 902-620-1309 or Michelle 902-964-3377. If you include your e-mail address on the entry form, ride times will be e-mailed to you.

Prizes

Ribbons to 6th place. Classes will be split into Junior and Senior for placings if entries warrant.

Scratches and Refunds

In order to help us to run our competitions effectively, please be courteous and notify the competition if you must scratch. If you are unable to compete due to a horse's or rider's illness or injury, and have scratched as described above, entry fees will be refunded.

Dress

Show attire is recommended, but not mandatory. For novice riders who may not have show attire, clean and neat attire will be accepted. In case of extreme weather (hot or rainy), adjustments may be made and competitors will be informed on the day of the show. Helmet and proper riding boots are required. Safety vest is recommended for Cross-country pace phase. Some vest will be available for borrowing if you do not own a vest.

General Rules

Every class offered is covered by the rules and specifications of Equine-Hippique Canada. Please be familiar with the rules.

Judge's decisions are final.

A given horse/rider combination can compete in two consecutive Levels only.

Two riders may ride the same horse, but the horse cannot compete more than twice.

Test callers may be used if desired but must be arranged by the competitor.

Protective headgear must be worn when mounted on the show grounds.

Dressage Tests Only

For those riders uninterested in the jumping phase, you may request to ride the dressage tests only. Additional dressage tests may be requested (EC and additional Eventing tests) and your test will be judged. No prizes or placings will be available for this. Cost is \$15/test (\$12 for HTPEI/PonyClub members) and will be offered as long as time permits. Please indicate which test you would like to ride on your entry form.

Stadium Jumping Phase

Listed heights are the max that the course will be set to. Degree of course difficulty will be appropriate to the level. For higher levels, some cross-country type fences may be added. Note that these shows are meant to be a schooling type and courses will be set with this in mind.

Pace Phase (Road and Tracks)

This phase is designed to help competitors learn and practice their Cross country pacing skills. You will be judged on your ability to complete the course closest to the time allowed. Time penalties will be given out as per normal XC rules. You will be allowed to complete the pace phase twice and we will keep the best time for each rider. There will be one cross-country type jump on course, you can choose to not jump the jump, but you will be penalized 5 points. Safety vests are recommended for this phase. There will be some vests available for use if you do not own a vest.

Terrain: Rolling hills, open fields and wood trails with excellent grass footing.

Stabling: Competitors to arrange their own stabling. The following are some possible stabling options:
